


What is human factors/ Ergonomics?

Ergonomics (or human factors) is the scientific discipline concerned with the understanding of interactions among humans and other elements of the system, and the profession that applies theory principles, data and methods to design in order to optimize human well-being and overall system performance

Domains of Ergonomics







Physical

Concerned with the human anatomical, anthropometric, physiological and biomechanical characteristics as related to the physical activity

Cognitive

Concerned with mental processes, such as perception, memory, reasoning, and motor response, as they affect interactions among humans and other elements of a system

Organizational

Concerned with the optimization of sociotechnical systems, including their organizational structures, policies, and processes.













